RBI Assistant Syllabus for Mains

The RBI Assistant Mains Syllabus includes five sections: quantitative aptitude, logical reasoning, English language, numerical ability (math), general awareness, and computer knowledge. Three of these five components - quantitative aptitude, logical reasoning, and English language - are the same as those in the RBI Assistant Prelims test, but with a higher level of difficulty.

RBI Assistant Syllabus for General Awareness

General Awareness is an additional topic on the syllabus. To perform well on this subject, candidates must stay up to date on current events and have a basic understanding of general statistics. The table below lists all of the topics included in the General Awareness curriculum for the RBI Assistant Mains exam.
