### **Bombay High Court District Judge Exam Pattern 2024**

The Bombay High Court District Judge Exam Pattern 2024 consists of three stages: Preliminary Examination, Main Examination, and an Interview. The Preliminary Exam is an objective-type test with 100 marks, designed to screen candidates for the Main Exam. The Main Examination is descriptive, consisting of two papers—Civil Law and Criminal Law—each carrying 100 marks. Candidates who clear the Main Exam move on to the Interview round, which is worth 50 marks. The Interview assesses the candidate's legal knowledge, personality, and overall suitability for the role of District Judge.
